Hauraki Primary School Policy Document

Sport

Rationale:

Hauraki School believes that participating in sporting and recreational activities enhances the development of fine and gross motor skills and provides enormous benefits for the physical and mental well-being of students. Sport begins in play and develops through teaching games for understanding. Sport plays a significant part in New Zealand culture.

Purpose:

- To foster a positive attitude, participation, and interest in a wide range of physical activities, including competitive and non-competitive sports, regardless of ability as part of promoting a healthy lifestyle.
- To offer a wide variety of sporting codes through effective teaching, field days, sport exchanges, tournaments, lunchtime competition and practices.
- To provide opportunities that contribute to positive interactions and relationships with others.
- To provide opportunities for developing skills in a range of sporting activities as opportunities arise.
- To encourage students to make informed decisions about their own involvement and development in sport.
- To encourage good sportsmanship and values of Fair Play.

Guidelines:

- 1. From year one, all students are encouraged to participate in sports teams that compete during school hours, including cricket, rippa rugby, tackle rugby and soccer.
- 2. In the Senior Syndicate, all students are strongly encouraged to commit to participating in at least one major representative Hauraki team, normally hockey, netball, basketball, or touch rugby.
- 3. It is expected that all Senior Syndicate children will have the opportunity to participate in Inter School sports exchanges.
- 4. The number of representative teams in varying sports is determined by teachers in charge, in consultation with the Principal. Community support is strongly encouraged to manage and coach teams, and the availability of this support may impact on the number of teams that compete.
- 5. Staff and coaches will be supported with professional development in the effective delivery of sport.
- 6. Sporting equipment will be made available to coaches and students before and after school, and during lunchtimes.
- 7. Sporting achievement and success will be celebrated.
- 8. Students will be encouraged to take leadership roles within sport.
- 9. Students will be encouraged to demonstrate good sportsmanship on and off the field.
- 10. Each year students, parents and coaches are asked to agree to a Fair Play Promise by signing and returning to school. This is at the relevant Sport Coordinator's discretion and draft Fair Play Promises for players, parents/caregivers and coaches are attached as Appendix 1.
- 11. School spirit and pride will be enhanced through House competitions as well as with sports exchanges and competitions with other schools.
