The following are a few important reminders spoken about last evening.

CHESS

If your child is wanting to play chess as an extra-curricular activity, please see poster alongside. It starts next **Wednesday 11th** and registration is needed before that.

ATTENDANCE

Improved regular attendance at school for all students is a goal for all of us this year in line with Ministry of Education expectations. It is noteworthy that there is a clear correlation between going to school regularly and doing well in the classroom. Please have your child at school every day by **no later** than 8.50am unless sick in which case you should ring or email the office and class teacher. Please note that holidaying, shopping trips and time with extended family during term time is not acceptable. If you consider your reason to be exceptional please put in writing to me before bookings are made!

CONTACT INFORMATION

If any of your contact details, addresses, phone numbers and emails, have changed please let the office know asap. It is really important that we are able to contact you if need be. We also ask that unwell children are picked up as soon as possible.

UNIFORM

It is expected that this is worn correctly. Footwear is either black roman sandals or similar with back straps. The other option is black shoes (no white markings or soles) with silver grey regulation socks. Please ensure hats and jumpers particularly are named. No crocs or slides are permitted. Smart watches are also not allowed at school.

PLAYGROUNDS

These are out of bounds before and after school. Tamariki are expected to go straight home at 3pm as road patrols are waiting for them and teachers are often working or having meetings after school.

PTA

An important group in our school is the PTA who organise social and fundraising events. They are looking for new faces. It doesn't need to be onerous and is a great way to get to know the school more and meet other parents. The AGM and first meeting of the year is to be held **Tuesday 24 February 7pm** in the school staffroom. All welcome.


SEESAW FOR YEAR 1 – 5 STUDENTS


