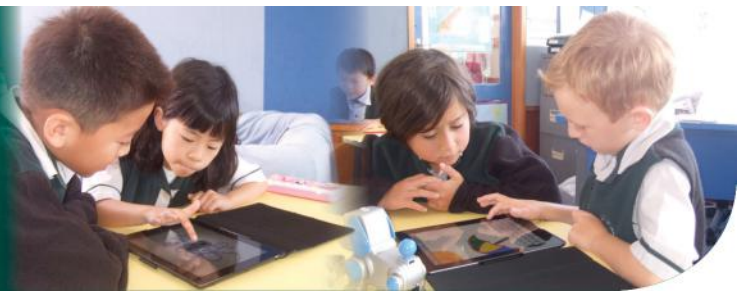

WORD FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

On behalf of the Board of Trustees (BoT) it is my pleasure to announce the results of the tri-annual BoT election. The Board comprises five parent representatives, one staff member and the school's Principal. As only four parent representative nominations and one staff (two people sharing the position) nomination were received there is no requirement to conduct voting elections for the parent and staff positions.
