HEALTH NEWS

MEASLES

As you are probably aware, measles is circulating in N.Z. and is very contagious. Watch out for symptoms – fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes, and a blotchy rash. Anyone with measles symptoms or is closely exposed to a measles case must stay at home and should seek urgent advice by ringing their doctor or Healthline on 0800 611 116. The health department is encouraging families to check their own child/children's immunisation status through My Health record

People are considered immune to measles after having two doses of a measles vaccine from 12 months or older, or if you have had measles before. For more information on measles immunity visit:

THREAD WORMS

Just to advise that we have had a child infected with threadworms in the middle school. This is contagious. We ask you look out for tell-tale signs that include persistent scratching/itchiness of the bottom, restless sleep, loss of appetite and irritability. To confirm any suspicions of worms, look for

- moving worms around the anus about an hour after the child has gone to bed
- worms on the outside surface of bowel motions

We still have some children who do not have hats. Please note that it is compulsory for them to be worn every play time and lunch time this term and next. Thanks for your help with this matter.






NATIONAL YOUTH THEATRE
