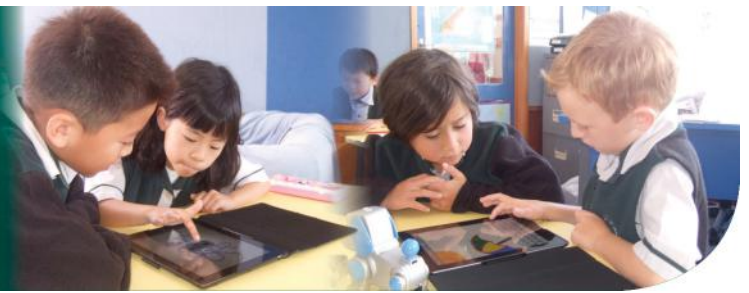

COHORT ENTRY

Cohort entry means that children entering school at five year of age do so at the beginning of each term only, that is closest to their birthday. 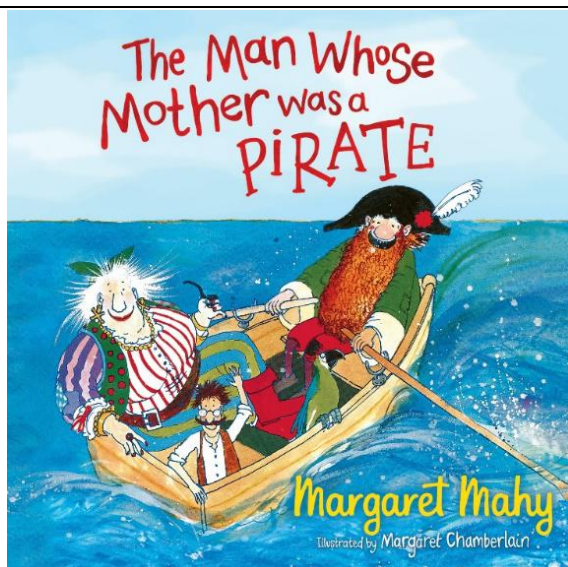
Ahoy me'hearties! Margaret Mahy's Pirate Adventure hits the stage this school holidays!
